




Wildlife Above and Beneath the Waves

From the acrobatic orangutans that swing through Sumatran jungles to the gentle sea turtles that glide amid kaleidoscopic corals, mesmerizing creatures await, whether you wish to explore on land or in the water.

Delight in the chance to spot eight of the world's 18 penguin species, four of which are only found in New Zealand and the Subantarctic islands. (See pg. 17.)




See Komodo Dragons in the Wild

It's a thrill to encounter the world's largest lizards in their Indonesian island home of Komodo National Park—the only place to see Komodos in their natural habitat. (See pgs. 19, 24, and 25.)



Spot Enchanting Creatures in an Ancient Japanese Forest

Yakushima Island's mossy forests are reminiscent of a wilder, primeval Japan—and a hike here offers the chance to spot endemic sika deer and redfaced macaques peering through thousand-year-old branches. (See pg. 26.)



Commune with Sacred Red-Crowned Cranes

In the wetlands of Kushiro Shitsugen National Park, find Japan's only breeding population of red-crowned cranes—a once near-extinct species that stands five feet tall and is considered sacred by the local Ainu people. (See pg. 27.)



Encounter Crocodiles in the Kimberley

On a scenic stretch of Australian coastline, board Zodiacs and glide into the Hunter River's thick tangle of mangrove forests, on the lookout for the region's prehistoric apex predator: the crocodile. (See pg. 19.)

Dive into the Coral Triangle

At the heart of this epicenter of sea life, Raja Ampat's reef system is carpeted in a tapestry of corals that harbors 1,500 types of fish, five of the world's seven sea turtle species, and seven kinds of giant clams. (See pg. 24.)

Meet the Orangutans of Sumatra

These endangered primates have many human characteristics—and they will capture your heart when we have the rare opportunity to search for them in their natural environment at the UNESCO World Heritage site of Gunung Leuser National Park. (See pg. 22.)



The Heartland of Adventure:

Peter Hillary on New Zealand and the Subantarctic Islands

Since boyhood, New Zealander Peter Hillary has traveled his country and the world–first with his father, the renowned explorer Sir Edmund Hillary, and then as a mountaineer in his own right. These days, Hillary adds 'guest speaker' to his repertoire, sharing his knowledge of the natural world with our travelers. Here, Hillary gives his hometown perspective on what makes New Zealand an exceptional place to visit, and why the Subantarctic islands are where "the real adventure begins!"

Do you remember your earliest experiences on the water?

They were on sailing boats, at home in New Zealand. My father would organize yacht expeditions, and we'd bring the boat right up to the edge of a rock pinnacle and make ascents straight from the boat. I quickly realized it's an incredible way to visit remote destinations.

What is the advantage of exploring New Zealand by sea?

Of course there is the comfort of being settled in your cabin for the duration, but the most important aspect is getting to see places that are difficult or impossible to reach by land or air. This is certainly the case with the Subantarctic islands—you visit little islands where people once lived, but have long since gone. These magical spots have truly been left to the wildlife, and the only way to see them is by ship.

What do you love most about your country?

I grew up in Auckland, the largest city in the north.

We have beautiful landscapes and spectacular wildlife, but I love getting out there—even to explore other parts of my own country—and I think that's a very New Zealand thing.

In southern New Zealand, we have the impressive snow-capped peaks of the Southern Alps, and fiord lands much like Norway's, with flooded valleys reaching into vertical mountains—it's stunningly beautiful. On the Subantarctic islands, you have beaches crowded with elephant seals and albatrosses, and great rafts of petrels out on the sea.

Why is it important to raise awareness of this part of the world?

The Subantarctic islands are an extraordinary window into what mainland New Zealand was like before humans arrived. It's a reminder of the impact that humanity has on the natural world, and that we need to preserve these wild, untamed places.




